- *Methodology:* The recipient must be a child of a member of OCBC, under the age of 18 years on October 31 of the year in which the award is made and who has not received the award previously. Three names shall be nominated by the Youth Activities Committee and given to the Commodore prior to the October Board of Governors meeting. Such names shall then be included on the ballot for the annual election of officers and the winner determined by secret ballot. The winner shall not be announced until the annual banquet.
- *Presentation:* The trophy shall be presented at the OCBC annual banquet, next following the close of the election.
- *Conditions Pertaining to the Care of the Trophy:* The winner shall be responsible for its care and safe-keeping, and for the return of the trophy for subsequent competition upon notification by the Commodore or the Board of Governors of the Oklahoma City Boat Club.
- *Rules for the Revision of this Deed of Gift:* Any revisions to this Deed of Gift shall be made by the Board of Governors of the Oklahoma City Boat Club as deemed necessary or desirable due to changing conditions. A two-thirds majority vote shall be required for any such change.
